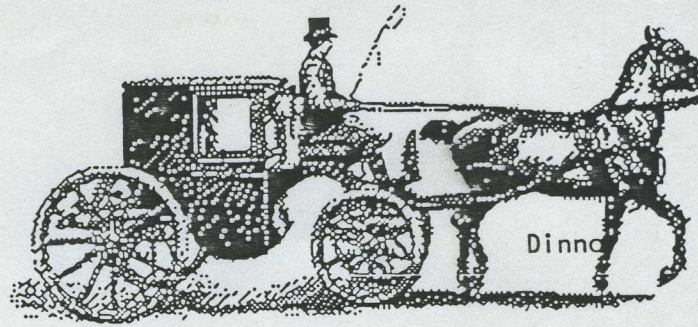

The cost of the meeting will be \$15.00, and still a bargain. Please fill in the form which is attached, and include a check to:


